

Automated Cash Centre: Terus menerajui pengurusan mata wang

Staying at the forefront of currency management



Bank Negara Malaysia bertanggungjawab memproses berpuluh-puluh juta mata wang kertas setiap hari. Bagi memastikan setiap ringgit diambil kira, Bank menggunakan standard tertinggi dalam pencetakan, penyimpanan, pendedaran, pemrosesan dan pemusnahan wang kertas.

Dengan peningkatan skala operasi, usaha memastikan keselamatan dan kecekapan operasi pengendalian wang tunai menjadi sangat penting. Bank Negara Malaysia is responsible for processing tens of millions of currency notes every day. To ensure that each ringgit is accounted for, the Bank employs the highest standards in the printing, storage, distribution, processing and destruction of banknotes.

With the increased scale of operations, ensuring the security and efficiency of cash handling operations became of paramount importance. These were some of the issues that the Bank's project team had to take into account in the conceptualisation and the building of Bank Negara Malaysia's new Automated Cash Centre (ACC).

The ACC was launched by Governor Dr Zeti on 21 April 2016.

Governor Dr Zeti envisaged the urgent need to develop future leaders who would contribute towards the advancement of the emerging world, especially in Asia. The increasing importance and influence of Asia in the global economy increased international interest to better understand Asia—the economies, businesses and people that comprise the region. The result was the establishment of the Asia School of Business in Kuala Lumpur, a partnership between Bank Negara Malaysia and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) Sloan School of Management.
